


NORTHAMPTONSHIRE BRITAIN'S BEST SURPRISE



BRACKLEY

A handsome market town at the southern most tip of the county, its centre now is the late 17th century market square. The town was granted a charter in 1260 but the buildings of that period and later perished in the fire of 1649. Thereafter, under the patronage of the Egerton family it began to flourish once more. The Town Hall in the centre of the square was commissioned by them in 1704-7. This is the finest early 18th century civic building in the county. The market square has a good range of shops, cafés and a hotel The Crown, which sports a handsome Regency front.
